The **PA Urban and Community Forestry Pass-through Grants** provided funding for the continuation of service and tree planting grants provided by the Pennsylvania Urban and Community Forestry Council in East Stroudsburg, New Milford, Clarks Green, Montrose, Factoryville, Matamoras, and South Abington. Communities submit challenge grants to the Council which include a well developed management plan addressing tree maintenance needs and planting areas lacking trees. A street tree inventory is encouraged for use in determining the percentage of each species they have and to plan for more diversity.

**Significant Revisions to Scope of Work**

This grant was given an extension due to communities experiencing drought during planting time.

**Project Accomplishments**

- Planted 295 trees including 40 evergreens, 255 deciduous, 193 canopy, and 102 flowering;
- Placed 18 cubic yards of mulch; and
- Pruned 86 trees.
